Theft from Vehicle – 2400 block of Clover St or 300 block of Washington Ave.

A theft from vehicle was reported to police after the owner noticed his backpack with two computers missing. The owner was unsure where the theft had occurred and stated it could have been in the 2400 block of Clover St. or in the 300 block of Washington Ave. The vehicle door was unlocked.

Domestic Follow - Up – 1700 block of N. Main St.

A 39 year-old male from Oshkosh was arrested for domestic disorderly conduct, domestic battery, domestic strangulation and a probation hold after a domestic disturbance occurred on Monday, August 10, 2015 in the 1700 block of N. Main St. The male left the residence after the initial incident, but was later taken into custody at his place of employment. He was taken to jail.

Stolen Vehicle – First block of W. South Park Ave.

A 2002 Ford Escort, silver in color with WI registration plate 270-XAK was stolen from a driveway in the first block of W. South Park Ave. overnight. The keys were left in the vehicle and the doors were left unlocked. Investigation continues.

Fire – 100 block of W. 11th Ave.

A fire was reported to a garage in the 100 block of W. 11th Ave. The fire continues to be investigated.

Traffic Detail –Algoma Blvd.

Oshkosh Police conducted a traffic detail in the morning to slow speeds on Algoma Blvd. at W. Bent Ave. 14 vehicles were stopped and 9 citations were written. Speeds were excessive.
