## City of Oshkosh COVID-19 Update 1

This information is current as of the release date and time, and remains subject to change.

**OSHKOSH, Wis. March 16, 2020** – In response to the COVID-19 pandemic Governor Evers has just banned gatherings of 50 or more people in the state—including restaurants and bars.

Also, based on previous recommendations from Governor Evers and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) on implementing social distancing guidelines to minimize the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, citizens are strongly discouraged from going to any city buildings. Starting tomorrow at 7:00 AM all City of Oshkosh buildings will be closed to the public. Employees will be working so if you have any questions or concerns please feel to call.

All emergency services will continue. All Oshkosh Fire stations will be closed for walk-ins. The Oshkosh Police Department is strongly discouraging walk-ins.

For any emergencies continue to call 9-1-1. For all non-emergency incidents please call OPD: 920-236-5700, OFD: 920-236-5240.

Go Transit is operating as normal.

Anyone wishing to pay bills can do so on-line or by using the drop box outside of City Hall.
